
WHY WE NEED A NEW SHELTER NOW

This is 56 Broad St. This has been our home for 22 years. If you're reading this newsletter you probably already know our story and our humble beginnings. In 1999 we were over the top grateful to have the opportunity to transform the Quincy Dog Pound into the Quincy Animal Shelter. Since 1999, we have called 56 Broad St. our home. We have taken in thousands of animals and adopted them back out into loving homes, we have reunited families with lost pets, we have fostered more than 3,000 kittens, provided hospice care for elderly animals, taken part in several serious animal welfare and cruelty cases including Puppy Doe, provided food and supplies

for families in need, partnered with Pets for Patriots, low cost spay and neuter clinics and rabies clinics, held car washes and Halloween parties and yard sales St. Pawtrick's Day and holiday fairs. We love our home we are very sentimental about this old blue building at the end of the road. Despite its many shortcomings we have created great memories here. We are a very important part of the community because we don't just help animals, we help people too.

But it's time to move on. The citizens of Quincy deserve the new animal shelter that will allow us to continue our mission and expand our services. Since 2015 there have been plans for a new animal shelter to be built on Quarry Street. This shelter needs to be built. This project needs to be made a priority. The new shelter will house Quincy Animal Shelter, Quincy Animal Control and the Quincy Police K9 Unit. It will be a state of the art multi-purpose animal care facility.

If you have been inside 56 Broad St. you know that the building was not intended to be an animal shelter. It was appropriately built for short term animal stays. Nonetheless we turned it into a caring happy place for thousands of homeless pets. Over the years QAS has repaired and replaced anything that was needed out of our own pockets. The building is now 32

years old and in desperate need of repair. In addition to what QAS has done to maintain the building we are grateful to private donors such as Dan Quirk of Quirk Automotive Group who donated thousands of dollars' worth of repairs to the roof, gutter, walkway and landscaping so our dogs can continue to safely use our dog runs. Not only that, it not compliant with current Mass Department of Agriculture standards. Don't get us wrong, this building has certainly served its purpose. However, as one volunteer so eloquently put it "this building is basically held together by bubble gum and duct tape!" You should be inside when there is a bad rain storm.

In March 2020, when Covid hit we knew the building had to be shut down immediately. And even now in November 2021, we must slowly and cautiously reopen. The space at 56 Broad St. does not allow for appropriate social distancing nor does it have an air filtration system. So we have delayed re-opening to the public until we could do so safely and now we're open by appointment on a limited basis.

Six years later we are still waiting for the new animal shelter. We know that these things take time and we are patient because we know ultimately it will be worth the wait. Unfortunately, we still have a long way to go in this process so we're asking each and every one of you who support the good work that we do to let your Quincy City Councilor know that you support this project. Just imagine the wonderful services we will be able to provide. We all deserve better, especially the animals.

including chicken and waffles which were amazing!






Hi Kit,

THE LEGAL BEAGLE

Legislative Updates from the Office of State Representative Bruce Avers. 1st Norfolk District



In 2014, with the passage of legislation following the horrific Puppy Doe incident, Massachusetts went from having some of the weakest penalties in the country for animal abuse to having some of the strongest. However, there is still more work to be done.

As a State Representative, I'm proud to sponsor legislation to protect animals in the commonwealth. This session I have introduced the following bills, which are currently navigating through the legislative process:

H2130: An Act relative to puppy mills

This bill holds puppy mills to higher standards and forces them to provide healthy animals to pet stores, as well as have more accountability. Pet stores would be required to purchase their puppies from mills that meet USDA health standards and have no violations. They would also be required to post the dog's breeder/health history and information clearly on their cages, which protects the consumer and the business owner.

There is currently no law prohibiting unsanitary puppy mills from selling dogs to pet stores in Massachusetts.

H2132: An Act relative to further increasing the fines for cruelty to animals, and establishing a fund dedicated to improvements for local animal shelters.

This legislation would increase the fines for those convicted of animal abuse by \$500 for a first offense and \$1,000 for subsequent offenses. This new revenue would then be placed in a special account designated for improvements to the animal shelter in the municipality where the violation(s) occurred.

H3102: An Act designating the month of October as "Adopt a Shelter Dog" month

This bill aims to raise awareness of the need for dogs to be adopted by ensuring that the Governor annually proclaims October as "Adopt a Shelter Dog" month in Massachusetts. According to the ASPCA, over 3.3 million dogs per year enter an animal shelter in the U.S.; of that number, only 1.6 million are adopted.

The legislative session began back in January, and all of these bills have recently received their public hearing and await decisions on whether or not they'll move forward in the legislative process.

Along with these important bills, other bills related to animal welfare have been filed that I will continue to advocate for as the session progresses. These bills include: H2547, "An Act providing for the care and transportation of police dogs injured in the line of duty" (Nero's Law);

H2148, "An Act protecting the health and safety of puppies and kittens in cities and towns"; H1824, "An Act protecting animals from convicted animal abusers"; H1565, "An Act relative to the misrepresentation of a service animal"; H903, "An Act relative to ivory and rhinoceros horn trafficking"; and H904, "An Act further regulating the enforcement of illegal hunting practices".

When it comes to protecting animals, we've come so far but we still have more to do and we can't do it without the efforts of animal activists across the state. Now is your chance to voice your strong support for animal welfare by advocating for these legislative initiatives.

We need you to write letters, send emails, make phone calls, and do everything you can to convince Beacon Hill that this legislation is important. Your vocal support for these priorities is critical to their passage, just as it was to the passage of the PAWS Act in 2014.

Working together, we will continue to make Massachusetts the safest possible place for animals, and continue to provide a voice for those who have none.



I started volunteering at QAS in May of 2013. I learned about QAS when I went to the State House Lobby Day for Animals and met other volunteers. Lobby Day is once a year when Legislators are in their office and take meetings with the public to discuss important Animal Protection Bills that are filed with the state and will be voted on in the upcoming session. Even though in 2012 Massachusetts became the 6th state in the country to end discriminating against a dog by appearance and not their behavior, there was still work to do. Homeowner insurance policies are allowed to discriminate by breed which makes it very hard to rent from someone whose landlord has a policy that discriminates or even find an affordable policy for yourself. It is a big reason why Pit Bulls and other targeted breeds are surrendered and remain in the shelter for much longer than other breeds. Sadly, every year the Bill goes to the floor and does not pass. Insurance companies are STILL allowed to deny people for what their dog looks like and many dogs in need of homes are left waiting because of it.

This issue is very important to me because I had an amazing American Pit Bull Terrier named Gargamel. I realized there are many dogs who were not as lucky to have a home and wanted to help give them love and care on the way to their forever homes. You can see how much most of the shelter animals know you are there to help them, it really is amazing. I feared I would want to adopt everyone, but quickly realized how much joy there is seeing them get adopted and loved by humans of their very own. Sadly, Gargamel died just shy of his 12th Birthday on October 23, 2020. It is heartbreaking, but I was grateful to be working from home during his final days. On July 2, 2021, I welcomed a 10-week-old Staffordshire bull terrier I named Bogart into my home. Staffords are commonly (and incorrectly) referred to as "pit bulls" but are a separate breed that is also unfairly targeted by Breed Specific laws. Since I will be heading back into the office sooner than later, I fear Bogart will quickly let me know how much he wishes I could WFH forever (me too Bo!)

I love the humans at the shelter and working as a team, everyone chips in and makes it a pleasure. I started walking the dogs and through the years have also picked up a hodge-podge of duties from ordering the cat litter, food for our guests, managing the wish lists, trying to help in any way I can. I am also the webmaster of quincyanimalshelter. org and administer the shelter's Facebook page, trying to keep them as up to date as possible with available pets and events.

Walking dogs of all kinds helped reinforce that all dogs are individuals. Of course some dogs have the traits they are bred for, but as long as every dog is managed correctly by their humans, all can have a chance to thrive. The dogs at the shelter usually know you are there to help them. All kinds of happy and sad situations bring dogs and cats to the shelter. It is a joy trying to help them. Last year I moved too far away to continue to walk dogs, and miss it very much. I still help with my other duties and volunteer as much as possible.

Our annual budget runs approximately \$250,000 in order to provide services to the animals in our care and serve the continuous needs of our growing community.

Our mission is to advocate for companion animals by providing safety until home placement of those in our care, to promote spay and neuter programs as a means to control pet overpopulation and to be the leading community resource for education on proper animal welfare
