WORKING TOGETHER: QAS, Animal Control and The City of Quincy

Our address has changed but the work we do has not. In fact, the need is growing. Since 1999 QAS has worked alongside Quincy Animal Control saving lives.

Our new shelter allows us to continue our 26-year partnership with the City of Quincy and Animal Control. The City of Quincy has provided QAS with a state-of-the-art shelter that will help us save more lives and offer more services to the community. That still costs money, a lot of money. Our annual operating budget now exceeds \$400k. QAS does not receive any state or federal funding. The city graciously gives us a place to call home, but we pay for all costs associated with animal care and everything else that it takes to run a non-profit business. This new shelter will allow us to do more, and it will cost more.

We must make a difference in the lives of animals. We are amid an animal welfare crisis fueled by a troubled economy and the rising costs of housing, food and vet care. While it is easy to love an animal it can be hard to pay for everything. We want to help. We must help.

But we cannot do it without you. So yes, we have an awesome new shelter. We are very lucky to have such a grand place. You might think "well they do not need my support anymore," but we do. You are the reason that we are still here. You are the reason that we have saved nearly 11,000 dogs and cats. 





















QAS Teams Up with the NEW ENGLAND FREE JACKS

SIMPLE TRUSTS FOR AVOIDING PROBATE

While your estate plan should include a Last Will, to avoid probate court administration after your death, all your assets must pass to the beneficiaries without looking at the Will. If the Will needs to be consulted, then probate administration is required, which increases the cost of administering your estate, can cause significant delays and opens the door for creditor claims and beneficiary disputes.

Including a Trust in your estate, and funding the Trust with assets during your lifetime, is an efficient way to avoid probate in the event of incapacity or death. There are many types of Trusts that serve all different purposes, with the most common being a revocable Trust. With a revocable Trust, you may serve as your own Trustee, amend the provisions from time to time, and transfer assets in and out of the Trust without restriction.

A Trust should identify a successor Trustee in case of your incapacity or death, as well as contain the provisions for the distribution of assets after death (provisions commonly thought of as being part of a Will). Because the Trust continues under the successor Trustee(s) chosen by you, there is no break in the title like when an individual owner dies.

Trusts can also be structured to provide estate tax savings, protect assets from creditors, protect assets from beneficiary misuse, plan for beneficiaries with special needs, plan for second marriages and mixed families, plan for the care of pets, and any number of other purposes.

Whether or not you use a Trust, please consider including a bequest to Quincy Animal Shelter in your estate plan. A bequest can be made for a specific amount, a percentage of your estate, or even as a contingency if your intended beneficiaries are not living.



Including QAS is as simple as having your estate planning attorney add the following language to your Trust or Will:

After my death, the Trustee shall distribute the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) to Quincy Animal Shelter, Inc. (tax ID: 31-1703439), 99 Quarry Street, Quincy, MA 02169, or any successor entity thereto, to be used for its general charitable purposes.

QAS is a §501(c)(3) non-profit organization, and bequests are deductible for state and federal estate tax purposes.



The Quincy Animal Shelter is primarily a volunteer-run organization. The Shelter relies completely on our volunteers and the community for support. Incorporated in November 1999 as a non-profit Massachusetts charity, we are also a recognized charity under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Service code. Since 1999, the Quincy Animal Shelter has placed more than 10,000 cats and dogs into loving homes throughout New England. We are committed to finding the right home for every adoptable animal in our care. Every animal receives age-appropriate vaccinations, is spayed or neutered and micro-chipped before being placed in its forever home. Delivering this type of care involves many volunteers, an active and dedicated management, and a lot of money. Our annual budget runs approximately \$400,000 in order to provide services to the animals in our care and serve the continuous needs of our growing community.

Our mission is to advocate for companion animals by providing safety until home placement of those in our care, to promote spay and neuter programs as a means to control pet overpopulation and to be the leading community resource for education on proper animal welfare.
